

Story and Journey

Geshaview Village, (George's View) was developed on a 25 acre site on a hilltop just outside the ancient tiny Hamlet of Gesha(George), where a single shepherd lived in a hut where he sheltered (Ramada)and tended his sheep, in rural central Bulgaria close to the town of Dryanovo. Geshaview Village now occupies what would have been the view from George's shepherd hut.

It is fitting that Ramada will now operate the traditionally built 5 Star shelter in its idyllic rural setting on a 15 year contract.

- A new concept in sustainable international tourism built on Community Collaboration, focused around a peaceful working educational centre of excellence for the performing arts. In this case a courtyard with the dimension and accoustics of Vienna opera house and a seating capacity of around 1500 persons is the central focus of this festival centre.
- Community collaboration rings through the village having been built by local community craftsmen and the staff will also all be local, and ABN will be the biggest employer locally.
- Geshaview was the vision of David Hollands who designed and built the village originally only moving away when the original investors changed their minds as to the usage of the village, to now come back to fulfil his dreams and progress the village to open as it was designed to.

- Geshaview or Ramada Resort Dryanovo as it will be known will be the central attraction of our six village destination hub around Dryanovo along with five other special interest educational villages.
- ABNL is already in discussions to replicate these village resorts and even full destination hubs around the world.
